

Portrait Workshop

SOME IMAGES FROM OUR PORTRAIT WORKSHOP ON THE 20TH OF MAY

For this meeting and workshop we went through the basics of setting up a shoot, lighting modifiers and how to set up your own home studio on a budget.

For the workshop we had two setups, one with continuous lighting and one with Studio lighting. Everyone got a chance at each setup and came away with the opportunity to get a variety of different shots.

The workshop was intended as a learning opportunity, intended to allow the photographers to get an idea of how to recreate photos that inspire them, and be able to do so with relatively modest equipment and budget.

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

Barry Durrant

We are privileged to have veteran press photographer, Barry Durrant as our guest speaker at our meeting on the 14th of June.

Barry started his career in 1956 and some of the important events he covered were images of the Wahine survivors in 1968 and the Springbok tour protests in 1981

Barry's story in his own words...

I started my career at "The Dominion" newspaper in 1957. These were the days of 4x5 cameras and B+W film.

During the next 30 years I worked in the newspaper industry until in the mid 80's when I set up my own business as a free lance photographer which kept me busy until I retired in 2013.

During the 60's 70' and 1980's I covered most

of the major news events in New Zealand and a few overseas. I count myself lucky to have worked at a time when the Press was the major news disseminator in New Zealand and had a better future than today.

I had become an expert on Search and Rescue stories because of my tramping background and could use my outdoor experience in many of the major stories that I covered such as the Wahine sinking and the Inaugahua Earthquake.

Covering the News was like a great adventure but my life was ruled by it so after about 30yrs I decided I wanted to be in charge of what was happening.

Photography has been kind to me and given me some great experiences and times. I always loved a good picture on the front page.

If selected, members will be required to provide a good quality matted print of their image as per the rules:


Rules (as set by the host club):

The photo topics for June are "On the move" & "Waiting". There have been some fantastic images coming through, so lets keep up that great work!


Starting in 2018 we are asking our members to submit images around two topics each month. This is a opportunity to share images on a more informal basis and get everyone more involved in sharing images.





Since completing his photography studies, Hagen has worked in staff positions at Photosport in Auckland and Sun Media in Alberta, Canada.


He currently works as a freelancer, producing work for variety of clients and publications both nationally and internationally including regular work with leading international agency Getty Images.

The Place for a Photographic Mentor

AN INTRODUCTION TO PHOTOGRAPHIC MENTORSHIP

I have been fortunate in developing my skills in photography to have people who have encouraged and taught me a huge amount about the art and craft of photography. It has been invaluable to have mentors with whom you can share ideas, explore photographic experiences, enjoy each other's company and accept the criticism they offer of your work.

The one mentor who has stood out for me and my development is Keith Walter FPSNZ. Keith is a resident of Burkes Pass in the Mackenzie country, a hugely talented photographer who has captured the landscape of the South Island and the Mackenzie in particular in a way that stirs the soul.

I first met Keith in Fairlie in 2005 when he ran an introductory course in photography for the local Resource Centre. That was the beginning of a long friendship that continues to this day, even though I have recently escaped to the mainland.

Keith takes a little time to know but behind an outwardly gruff exterior, lies a man who would do anything for any of his mates.

I treasure a signed copy of his 2014 book The Mackenzie Through My Eyes. This is a book in which Keith sought both to share with a wider audience his appreciation of the raw beauty of the Mackenzie basin as captured through the lens of his camera and to alert people to the threats this special environment is facing.

In the introduction to his book, he notes his growing awareness of the threats this fragile environment is facing "Poorly considered introductions of new species have wreaked havoc in the past. Today, radical changes in land use have the potential to destroy an unique part of New Zealand that is appreciated by many more than those that live

there." He was one of the earliest to raise his voice in protest about changes in land use and ownership that were jeopardising the environment of the Mackenzie.

Keith Walter was born in the village of Cooksbridge, Sussex, England and has lived in Burkes Pass for some twenty two years. After visiting former school friends in New Zealand in the seventies he decided to emigrate to this country, settling first in Tauranga and working in the building industry.

While in England, Keith's interest in photography took second place to his sporting pursuits in football and cricket. It was in Tauranga that he joined the local camera club. The rugged nature of the landscapes in the Tongariro National Park in the north and the Maniototo and the Mackenzie Districts in the south really attracted his photographic interest. Landscape and black and white photography quickly became his overriding passions.

He became a member of the Photographic Society of New Zealand in 1991 and a year later won the Maadi Cup for the best black and white image in the Open section of the Society's national competition. He was made a Fellow of the Society in 2012 with a black and white portfolio of twelve images of the Narnia Rocks at Flock Hill, Arthurs Pass.

I would encourage beginning and intermediate level photographers to seek out a mentor who can help them along their photographic journey. I know I have gained hugely from such a relationship.`





Submissions email: wpsimpact@gmail.com


- **Images:** Can be any resolution, but file size must be below 3mb
- No Watermarks (Images will have name/title attached)
- Other images Specs: High Resolution, Srgb, 300ppi
- **Image titles:** Please name files with your first name and last name and image title.
- **Image description** Descriptions/titles should be concise and be nothing more then a title or a few words which describe the image.
- **Submission Date:** No later than the 27th at 5pm
